Urgent request: Faversham Food Bank

The Faversham Food Bank is now feeding almost exactly 50% more people this year than they were last. The town continues to be generous and they are very grateful, but the amount of stock coming in at the supermarket collection points is not keeping pace with the amount of food going out. They are very short of pretty much everything except for pasta and baked beans and they will soon have to consider drawing on their reserves of cash in order to buy more stock. If you are able to support them, please donate in the bins in Tesco, Sainsbury and Morrison or drop off at the Gospel Mission. They can collect if that would help anyone. Many thanks.

The Apostleship of the Sea is a Catholic charity supporting seafarers worldwide. They provide practical and pastoral care to all seafarers, regardless of nationality, belief or race. Port chaplains and volunteer ship visitors welcome seafarers, offer welfare services and advice, practical help, care and friendship. The Apostleship of the Sea in Great Britain is part of an international network known to the maritime world as Stella Maris. working in more than 250 ports around the world.

90% of world trade is transported by ship. However the life of a modern seafarer can be dangerous and lonely. They may spend up to a year at a time away from home, separated from their family and loved ones and often working in harsh conditions. The Apostleship of the Sea relies wholly on voluntary contributions and can only continue its work through the generous donations of its supporters, particularly in the Second Collection.
