**Demolition unveils more challenges!**

Work in the church has now begun in earnest. Parishioners entering Whitefriars will have noticed signs indicating that the church is now a construction site! Internally it has become something of a shell, as all areas affected by decades of wear and tear have been stripped back. It has been a messy, dusty business for the builders who have been spotted with protective clothing and masks going back and forth to skips. The pigeons have been encouraged to find a new home; thankfully their residual mess was not as we had feared. The work is going well but, during the "demolition" stage, we discovered that electrical wiring had not been routed in the way we expected. This will lead to further necessary electrical re-wiring before the installation of the new LED lighting. An area of damp on the internal of the road-facing wall of the church has been exposed, which has over the years caused the lime render to be severely cracked and blown, so this will need to be rectified. There are some cracks near the top of the gable-end of the church, which also need urgent repair. Although not extensive and not a major concern, there is evidence of some rot and woodworm in a few of the rafters. As well as treating the affected areas, all of the rafters etc. will be treated as a precaution and for future -proofing. Despite the apparent essential soundness of the building, a structural engineer will be on site to advise and confirm the proposed course of action. Stage Two of the current phase involves the installation of insulation boards throughout the internal of the roof, followed by plaster boards in preparation for plastering and painting. As predicted at our Appeal Launch presentation, costs have already increased. We will present to the parish an updated target for our Appeal at the beginning of the New Year. In the meantime, we thank you again for your incredible generosity and patience as we try to prepare the buildings for the future. Please spare a prayer for those who live and work here.
